

VISIT TO DYRHAM PARK

South Gloucestershire

A special visit to Dyrham Park has been arranged with Dr Rupert Goulding following his very successful Attingham talk on *Dyrham Park and Imperial Imagination* in our Winter lecture series. The house, set within its ancient deer park, was built between 1692 and 1704 for William Blathwayt (?1649-1717), Secretary at War to William III. With its rich assemblage of materials and objects, this baroque mansion reflects his professional status and embodies his interconnected roles within political, military, and especially colonial administration. Blathwayt described colonies as 'enlarging His [Majesty's] Empire and Revenue very considerably' and at Dyrham Park this ambition found material expression.

Rupert (Summer School 2011) will lead the tour. He is the National Trust's Head Curator and has written extensively on Dyrham Park and William Blathwayt and his family.
